




PRINCIPLES OF PUBLICATION

THESIS

+	 Coherence between its parts Modification possible until publication Clear responsibility 	Multiple peer-reviewSuccessive international outreachNetwork

WRITING A THESIS ARTICLE

Rules

- Each doctoral programme defines what a thesis by compilation of articles means in terms of:
 - Is there a minimum number of articles required?
 - Details of the introductory chapter
 - Authorship; doctoral candidate first name
 - Minimum number of published articles
 - Status of articles in press, submitted manuscripts and manuscripts

In parity with requirements elsewhere

WRITING A THESIS ARTICLE

Preparations

- Carefully and informed selection of publication strategy for the thesis
 - highly regarded journals for the subject in question
 - journals present in the most common publication data bases
- Agreement of preliminary article production in the contract between doctoral candidate and the HEI
 - authorship
- Information on the peer-review process

WRITING A THESIS ARTICLE

Procedure

- The responsibility of text production is gradually handed on to the doctoral candidate from the supervisor
- Manuscript seminars, conferences

Support

- Academic writing; knowledge transfer
 - Informal, from the supervisor(s)
 - Formal, by <u>course work</u> or work-shops
- Language editing <u>support</u>
